
## The Fairfield Heritage Association

## **Sherman House Museum**

Civil War General
William T. Sherman
and his brother U.S.
Senator John
Sherman, was built in
1811 and is furnished
in the time period of
the Sherman family.
General Sherman is
best remembered for
his leadership during
the Civil War.

## **Georgian Museum**

105 E. Wheeling Street



The Georgian is a handsome Federal mansion of 13 rooms, built in 1832 for Samuel and Sarah Maccracken. It is furnished as it might have been in the 1830's, with some original pieces and early Fairfield County items.

and chandeliers. An
unsupported spiral
stairway leading up
three floors is
highlighted at the top
by a lantern light.

The FHA membership year is October 1 through September 30.


