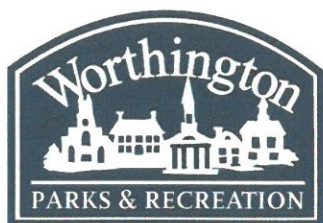
**James G. Ryan** - is the current president of the Central Ohio Civil War Roundtable and a practicing attorney in Columbus, OH.
