## Your membership helps preserve our priceless museums!

e are stewards of two remarkable landmark buildings: the Georgian and Sherman House museums.

The Sherman House, whose oldest section

dates to 1811, is the birthplace of Civil War Gen. William Tecumseh Sherman and his brother U.S. Sen. John Sherman. It is a Na-



tional Historic Landmark and features Sherman family treasures and an outstanding new Civil War exhibit.

The house known today as the Georgian Museum is also a Lancaster landmark. This Federal-style mansion of 13 rooms was built in 1832 for entrepreneur Samuel Maccracken and his wife, Sarah, and was home to many families and businesses through the years. By 1972, the building was badly

in need of repairs when FCHA purchased and restored it with the help of a massive community fund drive and volunteer effort. Today it is furnished with 19th century antiques, including several pieces by Fairfield County artisans.

Both museums are open to the public from April through December and provide the setting for many programs. Your membership allows you to tour for free throughout the year and receive a discount on most items in our gift shops.

Your membership helps keep these museums open and operating. Utilities, insurance and general maintenance alone cost

nearly \$60,000 a year, which doesn't include major repairs to keep these museums at their best.

he Fairfield County Heritage Association is a nonprofit organization that owns the Sherman House Museum and the Georgian Museum, promotes historic preservation and revitalization, publishes a quarterly magazine and provides educational programming and special

events as part of its mission to connect all people to the rich history of Fairfield County.

Association was formed in 1962 by seven women to stop the destruction of the community's historic homes. It merged with the Fairfield County Historical Society in 1968. The name was changed in 2017 to the Fairfield County Heritage Association to better reflect the scope of its work.

Volunteers created the Heritage Association and to this day they staff and manage the museums. The organization is governed by a Board of Directors working with an executive director and office staff.

You'll find the Heritage office in the back of the Georgian Museum, 105 E. Wheeling St., Lancaster, OH 43130. Enter by the building's back door and buzz for admission. The office is open Monday through Friday, 9am to 4:30pm.

Boys Industrial School, and Fairfield Heritage members.


