

# Noice at Sherman House for ArtWalk; 'Ohio Artists of Yesterday' at Georgian

**P**lans are under way for special art exhibits at the Sherman House and Georgian museums during the Lancaster Festival.

The Sherman House will host the paintings of Lancaster artist Donna Carlisle Noice.

Noice has exhibited in many places over the years, including The Knickerbocker Artists Annual Exhibition in New York City; the Boston Mills Art Festival; and the Crosby Ardens Art Festival.

The Georgian exhibit, "Ohio Artists of Yesterday," will feature oil and watercolor paintings as well as sculptures and carvings by several artists. Some of the pieces are on loan. Others will be for sale, with a portion of the proceeds benefiting FCHA.

Curator Charles Shaw has brought together works from:

◆Silas Martin (1841-1906). Martin specialized in landscapes and still lifes, but his portraits are well regarded, too. As a member of the art faculty of the Ohio State University, he was the first teacher of George Bellows before Bellows left for New York.

◆Elijah Pierce (1892-1984). The acclaimed folk artist created wood carvings when he wasn't barbering. The late Phyllis Gilmore was an early collector of his work. Her dollhouse populated by Pierce's family figures is on display at the Georgian,

◆Cullen Yates (1866-1945). He was born in Bryan. He maintained a studio and residence in Shawnee-on-the-Delaware in Monroe County, PA, and was well known for his paintings of the Delaware River Valley Gap.

◆Emerson Burkhart (1905-1969). Burkhart was born near Kalida and was better known for his portraiture and self-portraits. A rare painting of lilacs will be in the show.

◆Alice Schille (1869-1955). The Columbus native was renowned for her impressionist and post-impressionist paintings.

◆Harriet Kirkpatrick (1877-1962). She was a contemporary of Alice Schille and was a painter, teacher and screen printer. She was known for watercolors, but an original oil will be in the Georgian exhibit.

◆James Hopkins (1877-1969). His stunning works have been featured at the Columbus Museum of Art and at the Springfield Ohio Art Museum.

◆E. "Popeye" Reed (1877-1969). Reed was a dedicated carver of stone and wood. His nickname came from the cartoon character because he developed bulging forearms from his work.

A free preview party of will be held from 6-9 p.m., Saturday, July 14, with light refreshments and live music.
